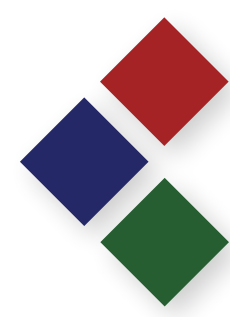

A Message from our President

What an honor to be a part of the Parsons Area Community Foundation (PACF), an organization committed to improving the quality of life in our local communities within a 25-mile radius of Parsons. The support from local people for this organization is amazing. In this report, please view the list of the grants awarded this past fiscal year, each truly making a difference in so many lives.

This November, on the Tuesday following Thanksgiving, PACF will host its third Giving Tuesday Match Day. What a special day when members of the community come together to contribute to the participating organizations' endowed funds. All donations are increased by the \$30,000 match pool provided by the Community Foundation. I am thrilled to announce that in just two years the growth in assets to these funds is 332%, and organizations are beginning to receive a significant distribution each year from the earnings of these funds. Our board is excited about this day, and hope you will join us on November 27th at the Wall Family Center.

After nearly 12 years serving as the executive director for the Foundation, Anne Allen will be retiring at the end of the year. When she started there was no office, telephone, logo, mission statement, website, or annual report, and limited community awareness of the Foundation. In her time with PACF, the overall assets and number of funds have more than tripled. With guidance from the board, in 2008 she was instrumental in PACF's partnering with the Greater Kansas City Community Foundation to provide fund accounting, investment opportunities, legal counsel, and enhanced donor services. The following year she submitted the application for a \$450,000 grant incentive from the Kansas Health Foundation for its six-year GROW II program, and was so gratified when that was completed this last year. We appreciate her work, and wish her the very best in her retirement.

Joan Vitt is our incoming executive director. With leadership experience in both the non-profit and business worlds, she brings sound skills to continue all existing programs and further grow the community foundation. We welcome her with open arms.

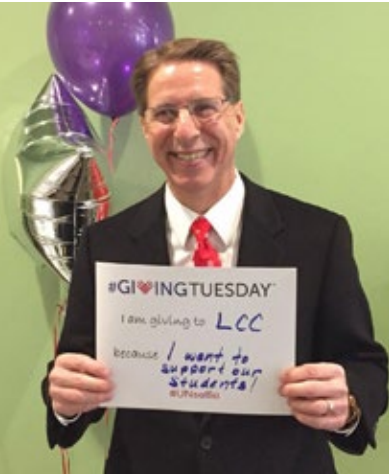


MATCH DAY ON #GIVINGTUESDAY

To build endowment for local non-profit organizations holding funds with the Parsons Area Community Foundation, PACF hosted its second Match Day on Giving Tuesday, November 28, 2017. To attract donations, the Foundation, along with \$5,000 from Tank Connection, provided a match pool of \$33,000. Donations up to \$6,000 for each organization were matched at 50%, with the remainder divided proportionately. The results are listed below:

* Donations received by the Parsons Area Community Foundation were not included in the division of the \$33,000 match pool. Those donations, however, did receive a 50% match from the Kansas Health Foundation GROW II grant resulting in PACF receiving an additional \$2,825 from this event.

2017 was the final year of this six-year grant to receive matching funds of up to \$450,000 from the Kansas Health Foundation GROW II program. With the generous donations of numerous individuals and businesses to qualifying endowed funds, PACF is delighted to report the grant was completed. Local agencies may place funds with Parsons Area Community Foundation for growth and investment. When the donor passes, the community foundation receives the balance of the gift.

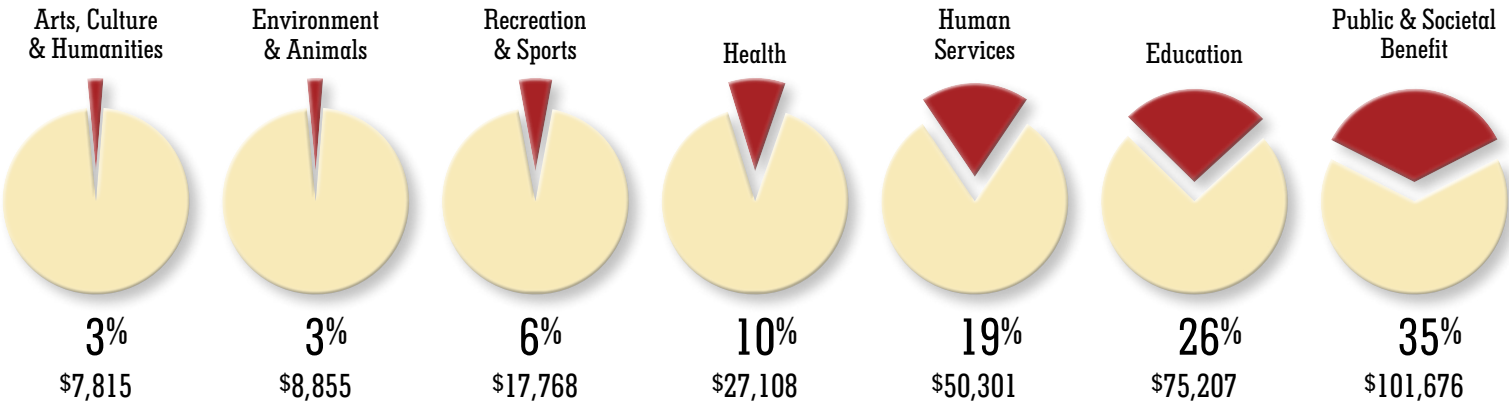
